Who Would Jesus Vote For?

By the time you read this we may know the results of the American Presidential election. As I write, both candidates are hurrying from meeting to meeting and dinner to dinner on the 'rubber chicken circuit'. I find it odd that in the world's greatest democracy only a rich man stands any chance of being elected President. This year, more than ever will be spent on advertising and the promotion of the two men and their parties - over a billion dollars, it seems. Religion will play a much greater part in the thinking of Americans about their vote than it would in Britain. But the religious focus will be almost entirely on issues like abortion, homosexuality and gay marriage, things about which Jesus said little or nothing. I suspect that hardly anyone is quoting Jesus' words about the rich: "*It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.*" (Mark 10.25).

The first Christians knew the power of the rich in their time. St James urges them not to discriminate against the poor in the seating arrangements in church, and goes on to say "*You have dishonoured the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court?*" (James 2.6). Later he excoriates the rich: "*Come now, you rich people, weep and wail for the miseries that are coming to you... Listen! The wages of the labourers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, cry out, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. You have lived on the earth in luxury and in pleasure; you have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter*" (5.1, 4, 5). In the Old Testament the Psalms also talk about the 'prosperity of the wicked' and wonder why people admire them - read Psalm 73. How is it that no-one quotes these words? Would that just be what some call 'the politics of envy', or a glimpse of the real world?

Charlecote Park

In November Charlecote Park will be open every day from 10.30am but takes on a different feel as the season rolls on. The stags will be quieter than in the recent past. Stayin' Alive!

It started as a fairly normal Hampton Lucy Saturday for me, but that changed with the knock at the door. It was a stranger to say that one of my neighbours had collapsed and needed help. What happened next was something that you usually only see on the TV, but this time it was real. Together with a second cyclist and then the paramedics, I was able to use CPR to try to resuscitate my neighbour, who had suffered a heart attack. Sadly, unlike TV, this story didn't have a happy ending and, despite our efforts, Peter passed away a few hours later. Like all of you, I'm just a normal person who is happy to help out where I can and don't consider that I'm a hero for doing what I did. Some people have said to me "Do you think this is a good time to start the conversation about getting a defibrillator?" I don't know the answer to that, but I do know that having a machine is no substitute for having people around who know what to do. According to the British Heart Foundation each year over 300,000 people have a heart attack away from hospital. In the places where we work, eat and shop there are often people with a basic level of first-aid who can help if we need it. At home, we don't have that support, and instead rely solely on the emergency services. They do a fantastic job, they are the real heroes, but they're not always close by and, at times like this, every second counts. There are many organisations that can provide basic first - aid training. * A good place to start is by getting involved with one of the Heartstart schemes organised by the British Heart Foundation: www.bhf.org.uk Actually, the BHF video 'Stayin' Alive', starring Vinnie Jones, is a fun way to learn the basics of CPR, and is being run on TV at the moment. For those of you who are on-line, check it out on YouTube. Give it a go, learn some first-aid and one day you may be a hero!

On Thursday, 11 October, we heard a most interesting talk from railway enthusiast Alan Bilby who has been closely involved with the resurrection of the GWSR, The Gloucestershire and Warwickshire Steam Railway. He showed photographs of before and after restoration work, with tracks, steam trains, a 1960 diesel car, carriages, and the Winchcombe and Toddington stations, all brought back to life and all achieved by hundreds of enthusiastic volunteers, paid for by donations and fund-raising. This heritage railway and tourist attraction is now visited by 6000 visitors a year and has an annual turnover of £100,000. Work on Broadway Station has been slowed down by two costly land-slips but, as funds gradually become available, the work continues.
