Stephen Bennett, son of George & Flora Bennett of Rose Cottage, Tiddington, died on 15th April 1917 and is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Somme, France.

Arthur Biddle, son of Samuel & Emma Biddle of Bloxham, Banbury, died on 26th August 1914. His grave is in the Fontaine au Pire Communal Cemetery near Cambrai, France.

Walter Megainey, husband of Winifred Megainey of Chapel Street, Wellesbourne died 27th November 1917. His grave is in the Oxford Road Cemetery, Ieper (Ypres), West Vlaanderen, Belgium.

Arthur Partridge, son of Francis & Mary Partridge, died on 10th July 1915. His grave is in the Ridge Wood Military Cemetery, Heuvellland, West Vlaanderen, Belgium.

Sydney Partridge, son of Francis & Mary Partridge, died on 11th May 1917 and is commemorated on the Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais, France.

Arthur Rose, son of Louisa Mary Rose of Loxley and the late Frank Rose, died on 15th October 1918. His grave is in the Dadizeele New British Cemetery, Moorslede, West Vlaanderen, Belgium.

Frederick Howkins, son of Frederick & Mary Jane Howkins of Prittlewell, Essex, died on 29th April 1945 and is commemorated on the Chatham Naval Memorial.

Frederick Partridge was buried at Loxley on 20th February 1942.

The Parish Marriage Register records the marriages of two women who were widowed in the Great War, their husbands were:

Herbert J. Brain, husband of Elizabeth Emma Brain, sergeant in the 14th Battalion of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment, who died 8th October 1918. His grave is in the Rocquiney-Equancourt Road British Cemetery, Manancourt.

Charles Brookes, son of James & Mary Ann Brookes and husband of Martha Rachel Brookes, private in the 16th Battalion of the Royal Warwickshire Regiment, who died 10th May 1917. His grave is in the Orchard Dump Cemetery, Arleux en Gohelle.
