He also patiently and good-humouredly worked his way down a long queue of fans, (*youngsters and not-so-youngsters!*), autographing their books and their Harry Potter memorabilia. The event was a great success, largely due to Kate Evans' hard work and enthusiasm - moving the project forward, securing funding and equipment, and getting together an equally enthusiastic group of volunteers to help to supervise the club. 

Dear Friends,

This year, with Easter Day being relatively late (Sunday, 16 April), Lent begins on 1 March with Ash Wednesday. There will be special services at Barford and Hampton Lucy that evening.

The church season of Lent is, of course, traditionally associated with giving up something we enjoy, to show (or not!) that our self-discipline can control our desires. For some it is about giving up something like chocolate, biscuits, etc. in order to celebrate Easter by having some then. For others it might be a time to start giving up something you want to stop altogether, like smoking. For others a Lenten discipline may be to not grumble about anyone or talk about anyone behind their back. (Hopefully this might fall into the category of something we stop altogether rather than celebrating Easter by really grumbling, talking about someone, etc!)

Alternatively, or as well, we may want to put a positive spin on Lent by 'taking up' something rather than 'giving up'. As usual there will be some Lent study

groups, but we can also see these six weeks as a time to do something extra that will benefit others or help us to get to know God better. The possibilities are endless: a few kind words, a donation to a good cause or some time spent sitting in one of our Churches - Barford, Charlecote, Hampton Lucy and Loxley are open every day. Imagine the difference it could make if we all did something small like that each day from 1 March to 16 April. It might even become something we decide to keep on doing beyond Easter Day!

## News From Charlecote Park

Spring is finally here (*with a few hiccups along the way*) so why not book for our "Spring has Sprung Walk" on 8 April. Our Rangers will take you around the parkland and gardens, show you some of the delights that you might otherwise have missed, and describe what's happening. The ticket price of £10 includes a warming hot drink at the end - just in case it's still a little chilly. Call 470277 to book. You'll have noticed that redevelopment of the nursery site next to the car park is under way. Our opportunity to work around the historic Charlecote avenue and link it back into the rest of the property is very exciting. A small shop selling The National Trust's home-grown peat-free plants and the delightful Hairy Pot Plants is already open and will be expanded as the year progresses. The most popular cuts of Charlecote's award-winning venison are available for sale in the Visitor Reception building,

avoiding the need to walk all the way down the drive to the on-site shops. You'll notice that we are planting over thirty new native trees in West Park - English oak, field maple, beech, hornbeam and walnut - for future generations (*humans and wildlife!*) to enjoy. Don't forget to stroll through the woodland garden to see the beautiful hellebore collection at its best, but *please* keep to the winding paths and don't take a short-cut over the planted areas as this crushes the newly-emerging bulbs and other plants. Bring along your binoculars too. If you're visiting on a quiet day, linger for a while by the waterside - you may well spot the kingfishers.

## Hampton Lucy CoE Primary School and Nursery



The children took part in 'Safer Internet Day' on Tuesday, 7 February. In addition to discussing how to stay safe online during their Collective Worship, the children in Key Stage 2 spent time designing posters and making films to advise everyone about how to protect themselves, particularly when taking part in social media activities. They also learned that things they see on the internet are not always what they seem, and looked at strategies to help them know what to do should they encounter something which makes them feel uncomfortable. Through stories, the children in Key Stage 1 learned how to stay safe when playing online games. They made their own masks to act out a version of the story "Digiduck's Big Decision." All children were reminded to seek the advice of a trusted grown-up and to make sure that they are only communicating with people that they know. As part of their Animals Topic, Class 2 have been learning about Africa

and African animals. They had an African workshop where Father Clement from Nigeria, who is based at St. Gregory's Roman Catholic church in Stratford, shared his experiences. Two parents who have lived in South Africa also helped the children, sharing African games and food. The children made masks, a collage of Africa, and rain-makers. SA

### Creating the Countryside - Thomas Gainsborough to Today

Compton Verney's 2017 season opens with a major exhibition examining the rural idyll, past and present. Bringing together 'Old Masters' and contemporary artists whose work spans nearly four centuries, "Creating the Countryside" is an exploration of the artistic, social and political forces that have informed notions of our 'green and pleasant land'. This exhibition distils our myriad fantasies of rural life and landscape, as historic works sit alongside contemporary pieces by painters, photographers, sculptors - even video game makers. By comparing historic and contemporary works, Compton Verney curator Verity Elson, in association with Dr Rosemary Shirley of Manchester School of Art, Manchester Metropolitan University, will expand the traditional view of the countryside and draw attention to the complexity of what is before us, revealing how our vision is so often culturally directed. From high art to propaganda, Constable to the country cottage jigsaw - these representations of the countryside all contribute to our understanding of the 'rural'. The exhibition runs from 18 March to 18 June 2017 and is accompanied by a book published by Paul Holberton, *Creating the Countryside: The Rural Idyll Past and Present*, bringing together expert contributors from a wide range of different disciplines including art history, rural history, literature and contemporary art.
