WI Goes Green

On Tuesday, July 24, the Met Office issued an amber warning for extreme heat but it didn't deter the ladies of Hampton Lucy and Charlecote WI or their guests. Off they went to Valefresco in Hampton Lucy to see *vertical hydroponics* in action. Only last January a government report entitled *A Green Future: Our 25 year plan to improve the environment**

highlighted the innovative collaborative research work of Saturn Bioponics and Valefresco who were working together growing Pak Choi in vertical columns under a polytunnel. They are now growing a variety of green leaf lettuce destined for the sandwich making industry with a buyer already lined up. We were welcomed by Nick Mauro from Valefresco and Arnoud Witterveen from Saturn Bioponics. The first impression of one of the visitors was that the system resembled a car wash - with rows of green brushes. Like many innovations, it seems such a simple idea. Each container is filled with unglazed clay pellets and the pumped nutrient solution, precisely monitored, circulates from the top down. Arnoud explained that the system uses 95% less water compared to growing in open ground - very relevant this summer - and the yield is four times greater per square metre than traditional land use. The system uses no pesticides



and no additional fertiliser and it was impressive to see a complete absence of leaf damage or discoloration. Every plant was pristine. Harvesting by hand-picking is easy, the crops need no washing and are ready to eat, and the samples tasted were delicious. Arnoud explained that the system could be adapted for many different crops including fruit such as strawberries. It was a fascinating visit and wonderful to see such innovation right on our doorstep. Dear Friends,

I saw something in the media recently about the numbers of people listening to the news on a certain well-known news programme falling. This might have been to do with more people getting their news on the internet but, in fact, the evidence seemed to be that people were listening to less news because it was all too depressing. That certainly struck a chord with me.

Being born in 1955, I have lived during wars in Vietnam, the Falklands, the Gulf (twice) and Afghanistan. Along with other conflicts they have all been terrible and very worrying at the time. But now I find myself worrying in a different way.

All of those conflicts were with external enemies. Now it seems that our own society is becoming much more divided. There is Brexit, of course. But extreme views seem to be much more common generally, whether of left or right; in relation to people of other faiths; or around how to tackle issues around immigration; etc. It feels like the idea of common ground that we might

negotiate from has disappeared. Compromise seems to be regarded as weakness or failure. And respect for those with different views or practices is getting rarer. This trend seems to be true both nationally and internationally and it is very disturbing.

Yet at the heart of Christianity is a command to "love our neighbour with all our heart and soul and mind and strength" and the example of a man who did just that. That man, Jesus, also even told his followers to 'love your enemy'. In a time of increasing division it is vital that all Christians and all people of good will seek to hold on to the kind of moderation and inclusiveness that does not just create winners and losers but looks to the interests and well-being of all, recognising diversity of views but looking to establish the best degree of unity which can be found. I pray we may succeed in reversing this trend. People might even feel able to listen to the news again!


Hampton Lucy and Charlecote WI

A skilled equestrian, Astley demonstrated trick riding in a circle, rather than a straight line as his rivals did, and thus chanced on the format which was later named a 'circus'. In 1770 he hired acrobats, tightrope walkers, jugglers and a clown to fill in the pauses between acts. It was an entertaining evening, members were invited to participate, and everyone enjoyed trying some of the circus skills. As part of the Warwickshire Federation's centenary celebrations, nine members of Hampton Lucy and Charlecote WI joined over eight hundred WI members from across Warwickshire on 30 July in Lincoln. We congregated in Lincoln Cathedral, refreshments were provided and, after the speeches and votes of thanks to the organisers, members were free to explore the magnificent cathedral and enjoy the lovely city of Lincoln. UBUS - Community Transport Service

UBUS is a dial-a-ride community transport service operating within Stratford District. UBUS is available to anyone in the district who struggles to access public transport due to mobility issues, health problems or who lives in an area with no, or infrequent, public transport. Passengers can travel between 9:30am and 2:30pm. We will collect passengers from their door, drop them off at their destination, pick up again at the agreed point and drop off back at home. Drivers can assist passengers to get on and off the bus and will help with up to 3 shopping bags or a trolley if necessary. All UBUS vehicles can accommodate a wheelchair. Depending on where residents live in the district, a single journey costs £2.10, £2.70 or £3.40. Return journeys £4.20, £5.40 or £6.80. Residents living in an Orbit property are eligible for a £0.60 discount on their journey. Journeys need to be booked up to seven days in advance. UBUS provides transport in different parts of the district on specific days.

UBUS can be used to visit friends, attend social groups, leisure activities or go shopping. It cannot be used to attend medical appointments. UBUS is supported by Stratford District Council, Warwickshire County Council and Stratford Town Trust.
