From Your Vicar

It is wonderful to be worshipping together in our churches again. Things are not as they were but our period of absence has highlighted the privilege we usually enjoy. As I walked towards the church building on Sunday, I heard the call of a squirrel in an oak tree above me and a nibbled acorn landed at my feet. It was as though I was being heckled from the 'cheap seats' and the service hadn't even started.

Acorns have fascinated me since childhood, perhaps partly because they look almost alien. The well-worn comment that from a tiny acorn comes a mighty oak tree is such a dramatic thought when standing next to the gnarled bark trunk. It puts me in mind of Jesus's comment (Matthew chapter 17) that even faith the size of mustard seed can see dramatic results.

Faith is a conscious orientation of heart and mind, it's something we choose, a position we decide to take. Finding faith takes effort on our part and sometimes we can feel that our faith is too small, too fragile, to sustain us through the ever rolling seasons of life. Jesus's words reassure us that even the smallest kernel of faith can make a big difference.


