Loxley WI



The guest speaker was Dr. Ken Cockshull who gave an illustrated talk about The Charles Maries Trail, a collection of some of the many plants brought back by the Victorian plant collector from his travels abroad. Charles Maries was born in the village in 1851, attending the Grammar School, now part of 'Avonside', where he acquired his lifelong interest in plants before moving up to Lancashire to start work as a nurseryman. Dear Friends,

One of my favourite films is "Il Postino". In the film Pablo Neruda, the famous Chilean poet and his wife, are exiled to a small Italian island. The semi-literate son of a local fisherman is hired as an extra postman because of the huge increase in mail caused by the poet's arrival.

The focus of the film is the unlikely and touching friendship that develops between the two very different characters. Neruda eventually returns to Chile and, after some years when the postman has heard nothing from him, he decides to make a recording to send to Neruda to remind him of the island. The postman goes from place to place on the island recording the ordinary, everyday sounds of the sea, the gulls and the people. It seems an odd thing to do at first but then you realise he is actually bringing to life what is normally just background noise, hardly noticed at all. And, in doing so, he opens up the world of the island.

We were on holiday in Italy last week and "Il Postino" came to mind on our return because, in spite of all the beautiful sights as we walked around, the moments that I remember most are those when we sat, and watched and listened. It is the sounds from those moments that stay in the memory and refresh – the sound of water washing against the side of a quay; the chatter of sparrows; swifts screeching; voices of children; the shouted banter of fishermen.....They are the everyday sounds that don't even register when we're in full work-mode. It is often only when we slow down, actually come to a stop, that we can start to hear and notice the world that is around us with any clarity or depth.

I hope and pray that, over these summer months, there are plenty of opportunities, whether home or away, to slow down, stop and find the peace and beauty of the world around us and the God who is at the heart of it all.


