Dear Friends

At the time I am writing this the Pastor of a small church in Florida has been organising a 'Burn a Koran' day. Though his church is very small numerically he has achieved world-wide attention or even notoriety, as even the threat of doing it has provoked outrage around the world and could lead to people being injured or killed by other people with extreme views. At present he has put the plan on hold but even if it never happens it has already provided ammunition for those who wish to suggest that the West and Christianity are wicked and absolutely anti-Muslim.

This raises a number of issues but two in particular. Firstly, modern telecommunications make it possible for something like this to reach a world-wide audience. But why is it that it seems to be only actions or words that shock, offend or cause harm that hit the top of the news? Is it not possible to get wide publicity for acts of selfless goodness?

Secondly, we know that there are Muslims who have put their extreme views into action and have brought about the deaths of many people. On this occasion the extremism is from the Christian side. For me, as a Christian, that is uncomfortable. I do not want to be associated with such views and yet I fear that for some Muslims all other Christians will be. However, in the 'cloud' of my discomfort I also see something of a 'silver lining'. I know that the views of Pastor Jones would be rejected by the great majority of Christians and therefore I can hope - and I believe - that the views and actions of those extremist Muslims who perpetrate acts of violence are also rejected by the great majority of Muslims!

That leads on to the question of how we can use modern telecommunications to make the desire of so many Christians, Muslims, Jews, Buddhists etc for a world of peaceful co-existence into headline news.
