A Beautiful Day by the River

After a lot of work raising funds, restoring the S.A.M.E. memorial on the banks of The Avon at Wasperton and researching the details of the two crashed bombers and crew members, the rededication service on Saturday, 9 April, was a successful and moving occasion. Blessed by glorious weather and attended by over a hundred and fifty people from the Benefice and from further afield, Rev'd David Jessett led a short service, remembering the ten young aircrew who died by the River Avon, now listed on the memorial plaque, and all airmen who have lost their lives in conflict. Group Captain Peter Wood, RAAF, (Australian High Commission in London), accompanied by Major Rob Johnson, (Canadian High Commission in London), the Royal British Legion and the Air Training Corps, all in full uniform, gave relevance and gravitas to the occasion. By chance, a black swan, native to Australia, swam past the memorial just as they arrived, to the surprise and delight of Group Captain Wood. Local representatives included Councillor Bertie Mackay, (Chair, W.D.C.), Councillor and Mrs Eric Payne, (Deputy Chair, S.D.C.), Councillor William Dowling, (Mayor Elect, Stratford Town Council), Councillor John Murphy, (Chair, Barford, Sherbourne and Wasperton JPC), and Councillor Sue Main, (Chair, Hampton Lucy P.C.), along with many others associated with the memorial. Dr Ken Cockshull laid a wreath in the form of an RAF Roundel. With the standards of The Royal British Legion and the Air Training Corps dipped, 'The Last Post', beautifully played by Ralph Davis, preceded the Two-Minute Silence. Then followed the 'Reveille', and the haunting 'Kohima Epitaph'; "When you go home, tell them of us and say; for your tomorrow we gave our today". Many visitors stayed for a while to enjoy the peace of the riverside before making their way back to Wasperton Village Hall for refreshments, provided and served by the residents of Wasperton and Hampton Lucy. We would like to say a big "thank you" to **everyone** who helped to make the day such a success, too many to name but all very much appreciated. Dear Friends,

Looking back to before Easter, the three Churches of Charlecote, Hampton Lucy and Loxley all had their Annual Church Meetings. These were all pleasant occasions, with the formal meetings taking about an hour or less and each being followed by some refreshments and a chance to chat about the past year and to look ahead. Churchwardens, Deanery Synod representatives and Church Council members were elected and accounts were approved. Each meeting then had a discussion about what had been achieved over the past year.

There was a lot to celebrate. Among other things, Charlecote Church Council were delighted to have completed the extensive roof and valley gutter repairs and Hampton Lucy Church Council has nearly completed the major work on the roof of the apse at the eastern end of the church. Loxley produced more confirmation candidates than any other parish in the Benefice. Looking ahead, the three parishes, together with the Church Councils of Barford, Sherbourne and Wasperton, have all agreed that they will work on a number of Key Areas to do with things like worship and spirituality, discipleship and mission, helping our neighbours, etc. We look forward to seeing the fruits of

their thinking, planning and action in the coming year. One new idea will be implemented from Sunday, 1 May.

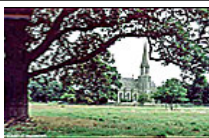
The New Church Service Pattern

Up until now we have had six or seven different service times in the six parishes and this has made Sundays logistically difficult. News from the Cathedral

Preparations for the Golden Jubilee in 2012 are underway. There will be a Festival from May to September. Michael Foster (Events Manager) has produced a wonderful programme of events. The highlight will be the service celebrating fifty years since the Cathedral's consecration on 25 May, 1962. The Archbishop of Canterbury will be preaching and a member of the Royal Family may be present. As part of the Golden Jubilee, there are plans for the recasting of the ruins as a National Memorial to all civilians who have lost their lives through war and conflict. The Rev'd Canon David Stone, (Precentor), announced that the Cathedral hoped to invite all of the Diocesan church choirs to come and sing. He asked what parishes might like to do to help the Cathedral celebrate its Jubilee? Peter Woodward, (Chair of the Cathedral Friends), spoke of the responsibility of Christians to be good stewards of The Earth. The Cathedral is in negotiation with EOS to begin a Solar Roof Club - an opportunity to have solar panels installed in the home, generating your own electricity. EOS will donate a minimum of five percent of each installation to the Cathedral. **AB**

The KS2 children visited the *Falstaff Experience*, and the whole school visited Warwick, particularly looking at the Tudor buildings, researching their topic on The Tudors. Foundation/KS1 children built a Tudor bakery in their classroom and baked some delicious bread. In March, the whole school had a great time when the Queen visited Stratford-upon-Avon. The atmosphere was really exciting, with the crowds cheering and waving flags as she arrived. The children supported the Red Nose Appeal by coming to school wearing their pyjamas

Mothering Sunday was celebrated by making posies of flowers and writing poems for their mums, which they presented at the Family Mothering Sunday Service in Loxley Church. Those readers who didn't get to the fund-raising SHN Warwick School Foundation Wind Orchestra concert in Shipston on 25 March missed an absolute treat, with the young members of the orchestra showing enthusiasm, professionalism and virtuosity in their performance. The first half featured the full orchestra, a big ensemble which had deservedly won a remarkable Platinum Award in the finals of the National Concert Band Festival in Birmingham in 2010. They played a very varied programme, including two competition pieces which they were shortly due to play at the 2011 National Concert Band Festival in Glasgow. However, for me, as a fan of jazz, the highlight of the evening was *Jazz Lab* which played for the whole of the second half. They are a 'Big Band' and performed some excellent numbers, modern jazz and swing, amongst which two stood out in particular. A transcription of the Oscar Peterson recording of *I Remember Clifford* was played by a trio fronted by an amazingly proficient keyboard player. The full band then came back on stage to play an arrangement of *Fool on the Hill* which featured an outstandingly lyrical solo, beautifully performed on flugel horn. Congratulations to the music teachers at the school for inspiring these youngsters to perform to such a high standard. Next time, make sure you get a ticket. I guarantee that you won't regret it!

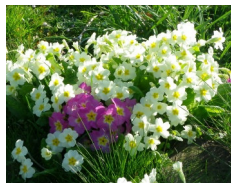
