Funeral of James Cooper

On Thursday, 5 May, the church of St Peter ad Vincula, Hampton Lucy, was packed to overflowing for the funeral of James Cooper. James, who was only 25 years old, had been on holiday in Florida with his parents and a university friend when he and his friend were tragically shot and killed in a suburb of Sarasota. James was a tennis coach and the mourners included his family and many of his friends and colleagues. The funeral service was conducted by the Rev'd David Jessett. Many tributes to James were presented, including a most moving one by James's father.

Tree Wardens Visit Hampton Lucy Spinney



Dear Friends,

As I sit here and write, the exam season is just getting started. The children in their last year at Hampton Lucy and Loxley Schools are taking their SATs exams. Elsewhere GCSEs have started, with AS levels beginning next week and, by the time you read this at the beginning of June, A levels will be in progress too. What a mindboggling number of exams across the country and a mindboggling number of children and young people sitting them.

I was with my youngest daughter the other evening as she did some revision for an imminent History GCSE. The revision involved looking at a card with a date on it; 28 June, 1914 for example. The key event that happened on that day was written on the back of the card. She then recalled the details, turned the card over and checked that she had remembered correctly. As it happens, 28 June, 1914 is one of the easiest dates to remember. It was the day when the Austrian Archduke, Franz Ferdinand, was shot and killed in Sarajevo. There was, however, a stack of these cards with the dates and details of the complex series of declarations of war and invasions at the outbreak of World War I.

Whilst it is very important to learn about these events, I'm astonished at the sheer volume of information that has to be absorbed, and then shaped into intelligent responses to given questions on the day of the exam. I'm sure I must have had to memorise swathes of information when I was younger but now can just look on with awe and sympathy!

Some students will be nerve-wracked, others will thrive on the challenge. Some will come out with multiple A* grades while others will not. Most will be somewhere in between on both counts.

It can become all-consuming but there is a quiet constant running through all this exam fever; the unchanging, unconditional love of God for each child and young person and a constant and secure resting place through the highs and lows, the processes and the outcomes.

Hampton Lucy Parish Council and Annual Parish Meeting

The Parish Council met on Wednesday, 11 May, in the Village Hall. Phil Ward gave a presentation on the results of the Housing Needs Survey, which will now be considered by the Council. The principal items raised included the Annual Accounts, which were approved and signed, the significantly reduced street-lighting costs and the rejection of the planning application for the Gypsy Site at Blackhill. The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday, 6 July. The Annual Parish Meeting was opened and Chairman Sue Main gave her annual report. Jo Hassall, of The Heart Rhythm Charity, gave a presentation on Automatic External Defibrillators. The meeting was in favour of pursuing the idea but fund-raising will need to be initiated. The 'Ian Wilmut Fund' is to be further promoted via 'The Grapevine'. Councillor Jeremy Whyman was delegated to generate ideas for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations in 2012.


