



The Restoration of St Peter ad Vincula Church - Phase Two

This project has been a major undertaking for a small parish and will shortly be completed, thanks to a lot of hard work and fund-raising, both locally in the community and from national charitable resources. The restoration has included repair and re-leading of the roof of the apse, extensive restoration of decorative stonework with sections of the nave balustrade replaced and a new stone cross to adorn the apex. The wrought-iron cross, repaired and re-gilded, has been replaced on its lead finial and the north and south aedicules were also re-built, having been removed and stored earlier, for safety reasons. These intricate structures were carved by the stonemasons with great skill using the remains of the originals as patterns. (See the photograph). One cause of the damage was the rusting and expansion of the iron reinforcement rods which have now been replaced with stainless steel to prevent similar problems in the future. A key to the success of the project has been the careful preparation of the work schedule by Stephen Oliver, of Rodney, Melville and Partners. Completion of the restoration happily coincides with the bicentenary of the birth of the renowned English architect, Sir George Gilbert Scott, (1811 -1878), who designed and supervised the building of the Apse in 1856, some thirty years after the Church was built. An Open Afternoon with refreshments will be held on Sunday, 24th July, 4.00pm to 6.00pm, and everyone will be most welcome to come along and admire the work.



Dear Friends,

Do you ever have moments where you find yourself wondering what life is all about? Or do you keep busy doing things, but then sometimes ask yourself what is the point of it all? If you do, you are not alone. These are some of the big questions about purpose and meaning in life. How can we feel happy and fulfilled in our lives?

I am writing this just after we celebrated Pentecost in our six Churches. That's the day when we think particularly about the Holy Spirit coming down upon the disciples after Jesus was no longer around to guide them. They were completely shattered by the death of Jesus and, even though the Resurrection amazed them and filled them with joy, they didn't really know what to do afterwards. When the Spirit came upon them they realised that God was calling them to spend their lives serving him by proclaiming what they had experienced to the world. Suddenly they knew what they had to do. They had a clear sense of purpose.

God doesn't call all of us to preach the gospel like those earliest disciples, but the idea that the way to find

fulfillment lies in doing things for others, rather than trying to grab at happiness for ourselves, remains true. As a Christian I find that the belief that the little things I do are part of God's much bigger plan to create a world of love and peace and justice, and to bring people to know and to love Him, gives me a real sense of purpose and meaning and the same is true for many other believers. The wonderful thing is that we can all pray for God to give us the Holy Spirit, just as he gave it to those earliest disciples, in order to help us to know what God is asking of us. We are all different and God never asks us to do things that are too difficult for us.

Now, of course, life is not always easy. Even when we have a sense of what we are called to do, and why, problems arise and need to be faced. The Holy Spirit can help us to face these difficult problems too. Pentecost may only be one day of the year but the Spirit is always available and God wants to help us because He loves us.

The 'Cross of Nails' visits Hampton Lucy School and Nursery.

On Thursday, 19 May, children from St Peter's School, Barford walked to Hampton Lucy bringing with them 'The Cross of Nails'. This is a crucifix made out of nails which were retrieved from the debris of St Michael's, the mediaeval Cathedral Church of Coventry, destroyed by bombing in the Second World War. On arrival, it was presented to Hampton Lucy School in the church at a service attended by children, staff and parents from both schools. Margaret Sheldon, our Diocesan Visitor, was warmly welcomed. The building echoed with music, singing and movement, enthusiastically accompanied by the percussion section from the Reception class, and the children of St Peter's School sang beautifully in reply! Rev'd Cathy Davis spoke about the origins of 'The Cross of Nails', and its importance as a symbol of forgiveness and reconciliation, before closing the service. Ceremony over and the weather being fine, everybody enjoyed a picnic on the school field. Shortly afterwards, accompanied by the Hampton Lucy school orchestra, 'The Cross of Nails' was taken to Moreton Morrell C of E Primary School, thus continuing on its journey around the diocese.

Revised Local Evening Bus Services – commencing 4 July, 2011
