Dear Friends,

Cathy wrote last time about a wedding she took. In our group of six Churches we seem to get a lot of weddings – this year about thirty five, with a lot already being booked for next year and more coming in. Many of these are for people who live outside our area. Sometimes they have had some link with one of our villages in the past but in many cases it is simply because we have six Churches which are all different but all beautiful in their own way and all set in rather lovely locations. In these cases the couples often have to ‘qualify’ to be married here by worshipping regularly in the Church they want to be married in for a period of at least six months.

For quite a lot of them – especially the younger ones – this is a relatively new experience. They were not made to go to Church as children and so they come to it with fresh eyes and seem to find the experience interesting and even enjoyable. What we are also now finding is that a few years later when they have children some of them are coming back to have their baby baptised – and some of them are even asking to be baptised themselves.

It seems that for some of them there is something about a

sense of community which they find attractive, while for others it is something about looking for a framework for life in a challenging and uncertain world. For others still it may be a wish to think a bit more deeply about God or the Bible or prayer.

Of course, we are happy to create opportunities for some of those ideas to be explored. We now have a little group of people (of a range of ages) who want to meet to think about God, Jesus and faith; and we shall be starting to fix some dates soon. For some people this may lead to what is called ‘confirmation’ (when you make for yourself the promises your parents and godparents made for you if you were baptised as a baby). But it is perfectly OK if at the end people don’t feel that is right for them. There is still room for one or two more to join in or we could create another little group. So if you are also interested to explore this please contact Cathy or me. Or come along to one of our Churches and just begin to think whether any of this might be important to you.

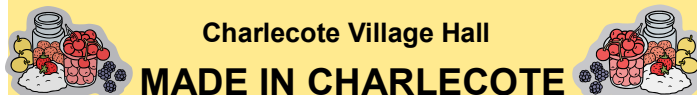
