Dear Friends,

I was looking out of our kitchen window this morning whilst trying to rouse myself with a mug of tea. My eyes settled on some tall, pink lilies, still flowering in the garden, and a clump of white cyclamen, which I couldn't remember seeing before or planting. On the shelf, near my hand, was a postcard that I'd bought years ago from a monastery. It has a picture of a Cotswold stone wall, part of an old house. To the right of the wall is an arched, leaded window, and stretching all the way across, from left to right, is the branch of a magnolia tree, with young green leaves and flower buds on the point of opening. I turned the card over and noticed a quotation on the back which, in six years, I had never noticed before.

"Pick up this life from the dust...and then in the morning let it find itself among the flowers that blossom in worship." (Rabindranath Tagore)

It was an unexpected moment in the day, when standing still, quite by chance, things were noticed that wouldn't

have been noticed had they been passed in a rush. The same goes for our memories. For some, memories can be pleasantly or painfully fresh. For many, especially in these financially tense times, we are so occupied with all that we have to do that thoughts about the immediate task, or the next few tasks down the line, drown out our deeper memories.

In November, there is a chance to slow down and allow space for our memories, to notice them, in a season of remembering. All Souls, marked on Sunday, 6 November, allows space and time for us to honour and remember loved ones who have died, with the reading out of their names and the lighting of candles in their memory. Remembrance Sunday, on 13 November, allows us to, quite literally, stand still and remember all those who have loved and served us by laying down their lives.

Love and prayers, whether you will be remembering in the quiet of your heart, or in the peace of your church.

## Help Us To Clamp Down On Bogus 'Charity Bags'!

**Warwickshire Trading Standards Services** are launching a bid to clamp down on bogus 'charity bags', used for collecting clothing, and they need your help. We are concerned that some householders are being duped into donating their unwanted clothing and bric-a-brac to private traders, believing that they are giving them to a registered charity. Warwickshire Trading Standards Officers want to investigate this scam, and are calling on Warwickshire residents to help. Householders can post suspect bags or flyers to us, or scan the labelling onto their computers and send it in by email. In both cases, please let us know where and when they were delivered.
