Ofsted Inspectors visited Hampton Lucy C of E Primary School and Nursery on 11 and 12 October, 2011. After two very busy days, the school was judged to be a 'good school with outstanding features'. A huge amount of work was undertaken to achieve this accolade, and the whole school community can be very proud of the outcome. Head Teacher Margaret Lunnon said: "We are delighted with our recent Ofsted report, as it is a true reflection of the school. It recognises the importance of caring and supporting children, alongside high standards of attainment and behaviour." Charlecote Park

At the end of October, over 130 people put on their boots for a "Boundary walk" in the Park - a chance to talk to members of the staff, and to explore parts of the Park not normally open. Hampton Lucy Parish Council

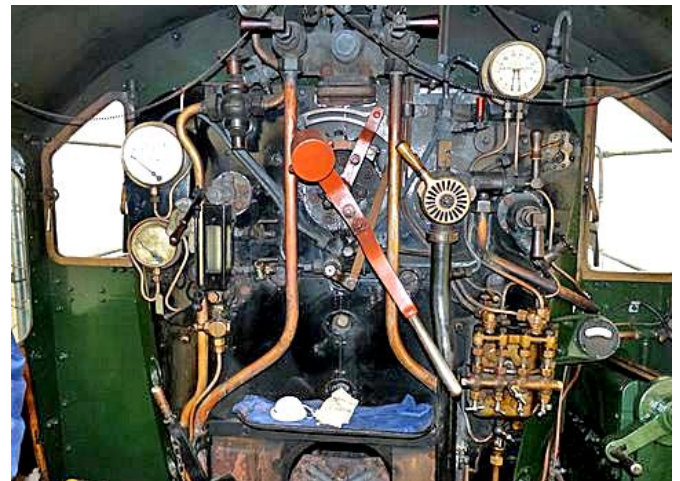

Every Schoolboy's Dream!



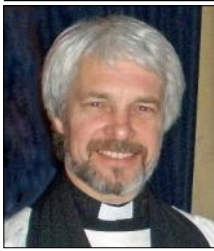

Dear Friends,

Every year, in one of our six parishes, (*you know who you are*), shortly after Christmas, some people organise an auction of unwanted Christmas presents. I suspect that not all of the items on sale were actually gifts from the Christmas just gone, but the principle remains that they are things which people have and do not want. People then buy a ticket, come along to have a browse and then bid for what they want. Half-way through the evening a simple supper is served, and a bar ensures that, as the evening wears, on the bids become sillier, or more generous, or both! The money raised always goes to charity and two villages in Africa now have wells as a result of one year's efforts.

I was reminded of this as I was reflecting on Christmas itself and the reason for celebrating it. There may have been some kind of mid-winter festival even before Christians brought the message of Christ to our shores, and some people may prefer simply to see themselves as celebrating something like that around 25th December. However, Christmas itself is a celebration of perhaps the most valuable and yet the most often unwanted Christmas present in history – God's gift of Jesus! Why did God come among us in Jesus? Christians would

say that it was because He loves us and wants us to get to know Him better. As human beings, we can relate to another human being much more easily than to a disembodied God. And, of course, through Jesus, God offers us the hope of eternal life in Him. What a gift!

So why do people often not want it? Maybe, we - the Church, don't always communicate what it means as well as we could. Maybe people think that to be a Christian means never being able to enjoy life. The first is probably true; the second certainly not.

However, the important thing is that, just as those other presents which people didn't want proved to be valuable for the people who bought them and the people who benefited from the money raised, so God's gift of Jesus remains valuable for everyone – even if some choose to reject it – because it says something vital about God's way of responding to us all the time. So even if we don't open or use that gift this year, it will still be there for us all in the future. Why wait?!

On 16 April, 2011, James Cooper and James Kouzaris were shot and killed in Florida. James Cooper's family live in Hampton Lucy and James' funeral was at St Peter's, where he is buried in the churchyard. Since the boys' deaths the parents have started a charity in their memory. This will work towards changing the lives of young people at risk of getting involved in violent behaviour. It will do this by education, by providing more positive experiences, and helping them to make the right choices. In addition, it will support the families and victims of violent crime with assistance, advice and financial support. It has already raised over £160,000 and is one of the fastest growing charities ever. All of the money raised will be spent in the UK. 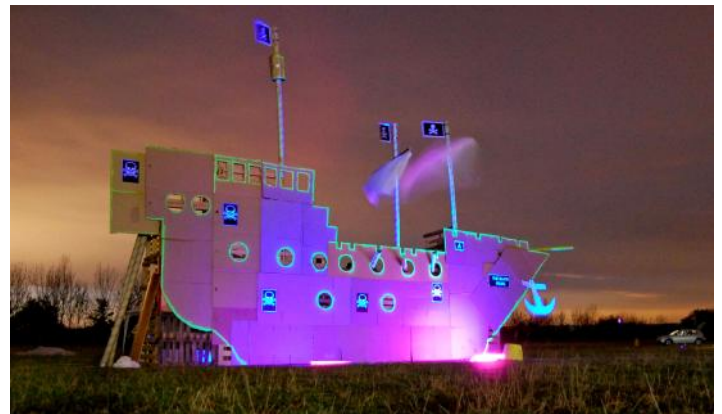

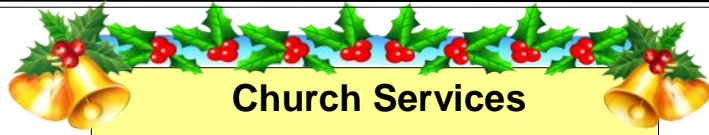
