"Thank you" to everybody who supported the event.



Dear Friends,

This year, for me, these next few weeks feel a bit like the calm before a storm. Following the busy period of Easter, and the Annual Meetings of the six churches. there is a gap of a few weeks before the Golden Jubilee celebrations of Coventry Cathedral at the end of May, the Diamond Jubilee of our Queen in June and the Olympics, starting in July. It feels like it is going to be a hectic but potentially a very happy time. (Note to self: mustn't forget that it will be our twentieth wedding anniversary in August!)

Thinking about this led me to reflect on the importance of special days. Some of these may be very happy, such as birthdays, etc. Others may be quite painful, say the anniversary of the death of a loved one.

Some of us are better at remembering them than others. There are those who prefer to live more in the present than the past and, on the surface at least, aren't too bothered about them. Yet these anniversaries, which are really our history, have shaped the people we are; in the case of birthdays and anniversaries, as individuals and, in the case of the Queen's Jubilee, as a nation.

(May I take this opportunity to say that I have enormous respect for the Queen and her devotion to duty. Clearly,

there are lots of privileges to being Queen, but it must also be very limiting and a great burden.)

So what do I make of these special days from a Christian perspective? Naturally, it is good to celebrate elements from our past that have been good - personally or as a society - and I imagine that all of the events coming up in the next few weeks offer great opportunities for people to come together and have a happy time. However, because I believe in a God who is always doing new things and is always willing to do new things. with and through us, I also believe it is important not to be trapped by parts of the past that have been painful.

The loss of a loved one, be they parent, child, or lifepartner, may feel like the end of the world, but people do rise above it to make new beginnings and, for me, a belief that we are loved by the power that is at the heart of the universe is part of that. It may not take the pain away but it can make new good things possible. So let's celebrate the past but also be open to new possibilities for the future.

#### **Charlecote Park News**

Charlecote Park was buzzing over Easter, despite the weather. The Easter Egg Trail, face painting and games attracted the younger visitors, whilst everyone enjoyed the new paths and the planting in the woodland garden. The flowers on the partèrre looked stunning, as did the pots near the restaurant. On Easter Monday the bread oven in the Victorian scullery was hot, showing visitors how bread really used to be made. The volunteer cooks who work in the kitchen have been very proud to win the National Trust "Bringing Places to Life" award, and some of the team are shown in the photograph. They are only too happy to talk about the recipes they use and how they cook over the open fire. Lambing was due at the end of April and by now the lambs will be



seen in the Park. Sheep shearing takes place towards the end of May or early June, depending on the weather, so ring Charlecote Park (01926 470277) for the latest information. On Friday, 18 May, as part of the Museums at Night project, Charlecote will be introducing a "Food and Flora" evening. Booking required, with a charge. The free "Walk with the Gardener" is on Saturday, 26 May, and a variety of walks and talks are available on most days.

The Diamond Jubilee in Charlecote

Residents of Charlecote will celebrate The Queen's Diamond Jubilee on Saturday, 2 June, with a grand event starting at 12 noon in the village hall. During the day a village photograph will be taken to add to the archive of Charlecote history already accumulated. There will be a champagne reception and Loyal Toast, and catering for lunch will be on a 'Bring and Share' basis, in the true tradition of royal celebrations. Other attractions will include a helium balloon race, plus fun and games for all the family. The Diamond Jubilee Project, a village hall wall-hanging, will be launched on the day. All parishioners are invited to be there to make it a true village celebration of a remarkable Jubilee. Make it a date.

Plans for celebrating the Diamond Jubilee in Hampton Lucy are also finalised, with an extensive programme for Monday, 4 June, free for all parishioners to attend with their families and friends. Church Street, suitably decorated, will close at 3.30pm and the event will start with a children's fancy dress parade, led by the Junior King and Queen, with ponies dressed for the occasion, and a Scottish piper to lead the way. A 'bring and share' Children's Street Party will feature Andy's Magic, a professional children's entertainer and magician, plus face-painting, games, treasure hunt, maypole dancing and free pony rides. All residents are invited to decorate their house fronts, porches or front gates for the day, with a Jubilee prize for the best. The 'Family Picnic in the Street' will get underway from 6.00pm, a 'Royal Picnic Table' will be selected in a free draw and 'Masterjam', a live band, will provide music to suit all ages, on-stage from 7.00pm onwards. Entertainment will also include a Tug o' War between a village team and Valefresco. The climax will be a torch-lit parade to King George V Playing Field, led by the piper, for the lighting of the beacon/bonfire at 10.15pm, the National Anthem, fireworks and Auld Lang Syne. 
