


Weeds also performed well this summer.

Dear Friends,

The view from the upstairs windows at the back of our house includes a whole variety of shrubs and trees reaching up into open sky. A few gardens away, emerging from the branches and foliage is a flagpole. It is attached to a neighbour's house. When we open the curtains and look out in the morning there is often no flag. Sometimes we look out and the Union Jack is flying – this might be in honour of a national occasion like the Queen's Jubilee or a personal one like the day our neighbour's daughter was married. We know something is going on if a flag is flying. Earlier this summer, I opened the curtains and saw a flag I didn't recognise - a yellow sun with red and blue rays coming out of it. I puzzled for a few days but eventually gave up and asked our neighbour about it. "It is the Tibetan flag," he said, "the Dalai Lama is in London." The same flag re-appeared a few weeks ago. I asked our neighbour if the Dalai Lama was back in town. "No - it is here because it won't be at the Olympics." There were so many flags at the Olympics, so many countries in the opening ceremony that the countries that weren't there hadn't entered my head. The Free Tibet campaign made the point that as Tibet is an occupied country, it would not be represented at the Games - the flags were being

flown elsewhere round the country so that people could know this and remember the people of that country.

This morning, on the news, Jacques Rogge, President of the International Olympic Committee, talked about the sheer kindness with which volunteers had treated the visitors to the Olympic Games and the sheer kindness of people as you walked through the streets of London. Amongst all the other things, what a fantastic legacy that kindness has become part of our national identity in the eyes of the world. Like all the wonderful things that have come out of the Games though, it needs to be carried on and not forgotten.

Perhaps that means kindness to those we come across in our daily lives, whether friend or stranger. But perhaps it means going beyond that, as the flag reminds us, to include those on the periphery going through a tough time, whether they are near or far. It is loving our neighbour in the fullest sense. Not a bad legacy to apply to our daily lives.

Hampton Lucy Parish Council

The Council met on Wednesday, 11 July. In addition to routine business, the on-going 'Speed Aware' campaign was discussed. The police report indicated that no speed reduction measures were needed. Traffic calming for Snitterfield Street was considered and a painted 'chicane' by the '30 limit' was proposed. There was discussion on the continuing use of the village roads by heavy commercial lorries. Valefresco appears to be taking all reasonable measures to prevent violation of the weight limit by its drivers. Possible improvements to the 'School' warning sign were discussed, with a proposal that the children at the school might design their own sign. Cllr Whyman was warmly thanked for organising the Jubilee Celebrations. He responded by complimenting the Parish for its very generous donations and thanking his team of volunteers whose efforts had made the event such a success. He proposed that any surplus funds and equipment should be transferred to the VHMC. Brian Buckley led a round of applause. Repairs to the playground equipment were in hand. A meeting with The John Lucy Trust to discuss the village hall had been proposed: Councillors Main and Whyman would represent the Council. 
