

Dear Friends,

I am writing this on the afternoon of Shrove Tuesday, eagerly awaiting my annual feast of pancakes later today. I am also aware that in, places like Rio de Janeiro and Port of Spain amongst others, they will probably have been partying for the last two days. I once had the pleasure of being in Port of Spain for Carnival and it was an amazing experience. People had spent most of the year since the previous Carnival planning and preparing their carnival costumes and music and it all made for a spectacular two days of festivities. But at midnight on the Tuesday evening it all stopped as Ash Wednesday and therefore the Christian season of Lent began.

In our own small way, here in Britain, Christians celebrate on Shrove Tuesday and then begin Lent in a much more serious way on Ash Wednesday. Many people will decide to give something up for Lent: chocolate, wine, or whatever. (Interestingly 'carnival' actually means "farewell to meat" because people would sometimes give up meat for Lent or for parts of Lent.) What is that all about?

For Christians, Lent is the time leading up to Easter –

one of the two great celebrations of the year – and so the time before that Festival is a time for making a particular effort to focus on God. We give up something that we enjoy but which is really rather trivial in order to practice seeing things in their true perspective and having more control of our desires. Some people go a bit further by giving something up and sending what they would have spent on that to a worthy charity. Others may look more deeply at their lives and try to give up some habit or trait by which they feel they let themselves or God down.

On the other hand some people may also take something up for Lent. Study groups often take place during Lent. Some people join those or make an effort to spend more time reading their Bible or praying.

I decided to write about this because sometimes people who don't go to Church are interested in spirituality and may find something in these ancient traditions. So although by the time this appears Lent will have begun, it will still not to be too late to join in. New beginnings can be valuable whenever they start.

Carers 4 Carers

Do you look after a friend or a relative who is ill, disabled or frail and are not paid to do so? Then you are a carer. 'Carers 4 Carers' is a self-help support group run by carers for carers. It was set up last November to support carers living in Kineton and the surrounding villages and countryside for whom travelling to Guideposts Trust meetings in Leamington, Stratford or Southam can be difficult. If you are a carer, your cared-for person is now in residential care or you have ceased your caring role in the last two years this group is for you. It may also be of interest to those who may become carers in the near future. Caring can be a wonderful, enriching experience but it can also be isolating, depressing and lead to poor health. At our monthly meetings we provide much-needed time for coffee and chat, followed by a speaker or workshop. On 22 March, (see Diary Page), we will be visited by Jeremy Wright, MP for Kenilworth and Southam. This will be an opportunity to learn about the government's policy on carers and caring and also pass on some of our thoughts and concerns. On Thursday, 14 Feb, June Stait gave a most interesting talk on the world of perfume. Quality perfume is expensive due to the rarity **INSPIRING WOMEN** of its constituents. Frankincense, derived

from a tree sap, was the earliest known perfume, and literally worth its weight in gold. Similarly, Civet is derived from north African cats, musk from the asian male Musk Deer, ambergris from whales, and sandalwood from sixty year-old trees, to name but a few. Initially perfumes were essential oils produced from flowers and London's oldest supplier, Floris, supplied lavender way back in 1750. Eau de Cologne originated in Cologne and '4711' was the number of the house where a fragrance called 'Miracle Water' was produced. With her wonderful collection of perfume bottles, June took us through the history of 20th Century perfumery, from Coty's famous L'Aimant, the first to use a synthetic fragrance, Estée Lauder, Chanel, ('No 5' is a hundred years old!) and Nina Ricci, right up to today's endless launch of new and ephemeral fragrances...here today, gone tomorrow. Finally, we were given two tips. Firstly, when dining out, never wear strong perfume that could spoil the aroma and taste of good food. Secondly, don't expect your perfume to last for more than three years, less if exposed to air and sunlight, so store it carefully and be fragrant! The next meeting will be held, as usual, at Loxley School on Thursday, 14 March, at 7.30 pm, when Marianne Wright will talk about Reflexology.

At the February meeting, Roger Butler gave a fascinating talk on the 'Magic of Morocco'. Morocco is situated on the northeast coast of Africa and is

probably the nearest country to Britain that is geographically and culturally completely different from our own. This was demonstrated by his beautiful slides. The photographs transported us back to Biblical times. The countryside and style of dress appeared to have changed little over hundreds of years. The landscape is dry and scrubby with distant views of the snow-capped Atlas Mountains, but there were colourful markets in the towns where camels are traded daily, along with produce of fruit, vegetables, spices and exotic rugs. He described it as a male-dominated society, although the women clearly work hard cultivating the land and harvesting the crops. It had all the appearance of a country in which time appears to have stood still.
