

Our Heritage Needs Your Help

Anyone who knows Hampton Lucy appreciates what a magnificent building St Peter's Church is. Even residents of the village and the surrounding area who don't choose to attend services can be proud of its presence in the village. With its historical association with Charlecote Park and the Lucy family, it is a beautiful church in which to worship and a magnificent venue for concerts and recitals, attracting many visitors to the village. Remember the charming musical evening performed by children from the school and village a little while back, and concerts by Warwickshire Baroque, Charlecote Festival Singers, The Stratford Choral Society, and Lyra, the splendid Russian vocal trio, to name but four. The drawback of such a large and architecturally significant building is, of course, that it costs a lot to maintain and to run. Over the last ten years, nearly half a million pounds has been spent repairing the tower and the beautiful apsidial sanctuary at the eastern end, designed by Sir George Gilbert Scott. If you haven't seen it since the work was completed two years ago, do make an opportunity to admire the magnificent stonework at roof level on the eastern end of the building, with intricate, finely carved stone finials and aedicules, (canopied niches for statues), and the newly gilded cross, facing east on its restored lead finial. I am appealing to residents of Hampton Lucy, and to anyone else who would like to contribute, to help us to maintain St Peter's as a living

church and as a magnificent part of our heritage. You can do this by making a regular payment, large or small, using the leaflet and standing order that is enclosed in this July edition of the Grapevine. The PCC urgently needs your support to maintain the church and will be extremely grateful for any help that you are able to give. The Hampton Lucy Jazz Picnic



Dear Friends,

The recent terrible murder of a soldier in Woolwich caused horror and shock throughout the country. People claiming to be supporters of Islam seemed to be suggesting that they were doing this for Allah/God. Now let me acknowledge straight away that the Christian Church has some pretty shameful episodes in its long history. Too often politics and power get muddled up with religion and the result does true belief in God a great disservice.

Sadly that dreadful episode in London has led to a wave of attacks on Mosques and individual Muslims, although the vast majority of devout followers of Islam will have been as horrified by that event as anyone else and would condemn such attacks as strongly as we would. There is neither any logic for regarding all Muslims as sharing the views of the most extreme type nor any excuse for more physical or verbal violence in response to that original barbaric act of violence. Even in the 21st century, two (or more!) 'wrongs' still don't make a 'right'!

One of the saddest things is that it can sometimes be a misplaced devotion to God that leads to such acts. For whatever reason, people come to believe that God hates people who have a different faith or even just a different

view of the same faith and wants them to be destroyed and they set out to do it for God. Former Archbishop of Canterbury, Rowan Williams, used to talk about "Bad theology" (by which he meant distorted understandings of the nature of God). The correct antidote, he said, is not 'no theology' but "good theology" (a more accurate understanding of the nature of God).

In this respect, Jesus' summary of the commandments is a simple way forward. In response to a question, Jesus summed up all the commandments of the Jewish religion of his day in the words "Love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength" and "Love your neighbour as yourself". And he went on to define our 'neighbour' as everyone including the people we might least expect or might find it most difficult to love.

The relevance of this to the issue of dreadful things being done in the name of God is, of course, that however devoted we may be to God, if we believe that God wants us to love our neighbour, (and even our enemies), as ourselves, we should never believe that God wants us to do them harm.

Repairs to St Nicholas' Church, Loxley

For the first time in a hundred years, major renovation work is necessary, and is already well under way. The main work required is to the church roof and tower, which was unfortunately not spotted during the quinquennial inspections. The bell chamber floor is unsafe, rotten shutters must be replaced, splits in the lead on the roof require flash-banding, and there are loose coping stones in the tower parapet. Rotten purlins, rafters and sarking battens also need prompt attention. During the preliminary inspection, a 'Turf' cigarette packet was found in the roof, dating the last intrusion to c.1953. Thanks to the very generous response of villagers to an appeal launched last year, and also using reserves prudently accumulated in the fabric fund over many years, the PCC was able to authorise work costing £30,000 to commence as soon as the schedule was approved by the Diocesan Advisory Committee. Being a Grade 1 listed building there is a lot of red tape to be overcome before any structural work is allowed on the Church. If you would like to see how the money is being spent, the church is always open for visitors. Better still, why not come to one of the Sunday Services and really appreciate why this simple building has been at the centre of our community for well over a thousand years. You will be most welcome.

The next stage is to stretch the panels to straighten any distortion, and we are then seeking expert advice from a top museum-based tapestry conservator, to ensure that the final process of joining the panels, backing, and hanging, is done to the highest standard to ensure this work of art will stand the test of time and will be admired by generations to come.

The June meeting was Members' Night, during which Sue Bresnen gave a glowing INSPIRING WOMEN account of the time she had spent on a course

at Denmans. The speaker was John Dunkerton who gave a highly entertaining and informative talk about DNA, the molecule that determines the characteristics of all living things. He described how it consists of two parallel strands, forming a double helix, an arrangement proposed by Watson and Crick some 60 years ago. Each chain is made up of many copies of just four chemical bases, commonly denoted by the letters A, C, G, and T. An 'A' in one strand is always paired with a 'T' in the other and vice versa, similarly with C and G, producing exact copies when a cell divides and ensuring that an organism's characteristics are passed reliably from one generation to another. After the talk, members enjoyed an excellent spread of food and wine. The next meeting will be at Charlecote Village Hall, Wednesday, 3 July when Heather Alford will speak about 'Volunteering in Nepal'.
