The Annual 'Beating the Boundaries'



On the first Bank Holiday in May, the community walk that we call 'Beating the Boundaries' took place once again. We were fortunate with a beautiful day and a good crowd of all ages turned up. Starting from Barford Church as usual, the route took us along the riverside path to Wasperton with an option to visit the RAF War Memorial by the river, by special permission of the landowners. We then made our way to Charlecote and Hampton Lucy, where pre-booked lunches were enjoyed, either in the village hall or at The Boars Head next door. The return route followed Shakespeare's Avon Way and Scar Bank, the last section being a really lovely walk alongside the river, emerging by the gates of Sherbourne Park. We are very grateful to all of the landowners who allowed us access to their land and it was a very enjoyable community occasion. The origins of 'Beating the Boundaries' go back to the days when the boundaries of land belonging to the parishes were often only marked by boundary stones that could, of course, be easily moved. The land was vital, both for food and its rental income, and the clergy, Churchwardens and members of the Parish would walk around the Parish boundaries from time to time to check that the stones were in place and to remind the community which was their land and where the boundaries were. These days we don't need to do that, of course, but we are now part of a group of six parishes and it has simply become an enjoyable, traditional walk through the countryside, although we do start with a prayer for the harvest. We try to vary the route a little each year so why not come along next time? It is always on the first Bank Holiday Monday in May. Rev'd DJ

Dear Friends,

So, this year June brings us not only Wimbledon and several international cricket matches but also the four-yearly football World Cup. It promises to be a real feast of sport. That got me thinking about leisure, rest and recreation. As a Christian, I do believe God wants us to enjoy life - as long as our enjoyment of it doesn't hurt or harm others - but we are also called to "love our neighbour" and, given how much some of our 'neighbours' have to suffer in our world, that leaves plenty of work for us to do, as well as earning a living. The complicated thing, then, is to work out the balance between leisure and work.

It seems to me that our society, and perhaps our world, is becoming more divided between people who have too much work and not enough time for leisure, and those who are unemployed or retired and for whom the danger is not to have enough work or to have too much time on their hands. (NB. I am also aware that, for some, it is more a case of... "I don't know how I had time to go to work!")

In one of the stories of creation in the Bible, God creates the world in six days, is pleased with what he has done, and spends the seventh day resting. The Church, from earliest days, has chosen a day, (primarily Sunday), for resting and

celebrating the resurrection by gathering together for worship. (It is not quite a day of rest for those of us who are clergy, but the point remains.) That suggests that, in a broad sense, for Christians, the majority of our life is to be spent doing our paid work or working at loving our

be spent doing our paid work or working at loving our neighbour in some way - if the two are not the same - but that there should be a chunk of each week for leisure, fun or play.

Another word often used for those is recreation. I like that because it carries with it the idea of being **re-created** in some small way by those activities - whether it is golf, fishing, reading, knitting, watching sport or any of a whole host of possibilities - including playing with toy cars! (..a reference to Rev'd David's interest in slot-car racing, for those who don't know...Ed)

For Christians, going to Church should also be a part of our being recreated. The busier we are the more necessary it may be. We come to worship our creator and to pray that God will recreate and re-energise us for our 'work' of creating God's Kingdom in this world.

So may God bless you in your work and in your leisure and may you get the balance right.

News from Charlecote Park

Lambing has now finished, with a total of one hundred and twenty three lambs this year, and the walk up to the lambing area has been really popular with our visitors. We now have two orphan lambs to be hand-reared, called Wilbur and Tubbs. Our new livestock also includes three Oxford Sandy and Black pigs – if you catch them chasing their feeder ball around the pen behind the stables, they are hilarious. Over the winter, we recruited fifty new volunteers, and some have already started working with TV's Dr Annie Grey on the Outbuildings Project. We are setting up a sewing group to make the costumes and you will soon be able to meet many of the volunteers in costume in the laundry and brew house. The tack room is open again now after a long process eliminating insect infestation, in many cases by deep-freezing the items. It must be nearly summer as the swallows are back, the croquet set is out on the lawn and the stags are losing their antlers. We are at present working with the community to offer walks for the Wellesbourne Action Group and a Friday "Health Walk" for local residents. We are also looking forward to our regular outdoor theatre productions from Heartbreak Productions and a midsummer music concert from Evesham's Avonbank Brass Band.
